Thursday Thought For The Day.

What does Peace or Shalom mean for us today? One definition according to Wikipedia; 'Shalom (Hebrew: שָׁלוֹם shalom; also spelled as sholom, sholem, sholoim, shulem) is a Hebrew word meaning peace, harmony, wholeness, completeness, prosperity, welfare and

tranquillity and can be used idiomatically to mean both hello and goodbye.' Peace is not just the absence of conflict or evil, it is a positive wellbeing. Staying quiet is not peace as described in the bible. In the face of the Windrush scandal it was important we greeted it not with silence, but a demand to put right the injustice.

Psalm 34: 14. Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it. [NIV]

Psalm 34 gives an interesting instruction, peace is not something that just arrives it is something that we have to positively seek and work hard for. At the moment the 'Black Lives Matter,' protests in America and across the world indicate that in terms of racial and social justice we have been too quiet, and not pursued peace with enough enthusiasm. This requirement to pursue peace is also repeated in Peter's first letter.

1 Peter 3:9-11. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. For, "Whoever would love life and see good days must keep their tongue from evil and their lips from deceitful speech. They must turn from evil and do good; they must seek peace and pursue it. [NIV.]

For there to be peace there has to be justice for all. And the true test of that justice, is to ask what is the justice and opportunity that the least able are able (can do) to help themselves experience.

DUNCAN' S SUNDAY THOUGHTS FOR THE WEEK

Lectionary Readings for week beginning 21st June 2020.

Psalms 86, Genesis 21: 8-21, Romans 6: 1-11, Matthew 10: 24-39.

The past week has in many ways been a week in which divisions between us as a country have come to the fore. Divisions over how various ethnic groups are treated by the police. Divisions over whether statues of historical figures involved in the slave trade of their day should remain or be removed to a museum. It is shocking that

Jesus talks about whether or not people accept him as Lord and Saviour, causing similar divisions between people who would be naturally very close to each other. Jesus is talking about the importance of placing Him as the number one person in our lives, having already said that we are defined by what comes first in our lives. In the end we cannot hide who we serve and who or what is our master.

One thing Jesus reminds us is that, whether something is done in private or when we know someone is looking on, our actions should be the same. Jesus' words are from a time long before mobile phones and video cameras but are particularly appropriate for today. In the world we live in, we cannot assume that there will not be a video record that will be on the web for everyone to see. Secrets do not remain secret for very long. As Christians we should be true to Jesus in all situations, seen or unseen.

In Romans, Paul reminds us that in Christ we die to sin and what is wrong in our lives. We rise to a new life based on God's love for all. This means that all will be treated equally, regardless of the differences between us.
