### **From the Secretary**

On Thursday of last week the Church made a significant decision, when it voted by a very large majority to proceed with the planned project to use 54 Cheap Street as a place to get to know members of our local community better, to see where we might help those currently in need (sadly there are many of them during the pandemic) and to show to the public that we believe God's love is for everyone. This will be for a 6 month period, which will then be reviewed.

There is still quite a lot to do before we can open up. The shop deeds are with a solicitor, being checked to see if there are any conditions that have to be met. We are very grateful to Robin Legg, who has spent quite a lot of time helping us in approaching the District Council in relation to planning permission. A Management Committee is in process of being set up, finances need to be sorted and the shop needs to be equipped. However Lynn already has a team of keen volunteers willing to be in the shop on a regular weekly basis and it was a wonderful surprise to know that an anonymous donor had promised £5,000 at the start of the project, to whom we say thank you so much.

In the circumstances January '21 seemed a possible date to open with a review in the following July. In the meantime, we have the first Advent Window on view with nativity figures from the Church and there will be a lot more to see as we approach Christmas. So, on behalf of the Church, our thanks go to Lynn for her vision and to all who are now actively involved in the project.

I have two more thank- yous.

Firstly we say thank you to Peter Kett, who has just resigned as a Councillor, on grounds of ill health, after serving for more than four years. Peter was always keen to participate in the life of the Church and we are grateful for his contribution to our Church, and to other Churches before that.

And then thank you to Raymond Wood, who has just produced the December/January Cheapstreeter, full of good things; and not content with that alone, he has given us all a beautiful Cheap Street banner bookmark. Thank you so much, Raymond.

We have many blessings to count as we move through these troubled times.

## **PRAYERS FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH**

**Brunei** -The introduction of Islamic laws affects the whole of society, Christians included. Non-traditional Christian communities cannot be registered as churches; they must register as companies, societies or family centres. As such, they are treated as secular organisations and are required to submit their financial and operational reports to the government every year. The sultan has the power to close any existing church at any time. Despite this fearful atmosphere, there are believers who continue to seek opportunities to share the gospel. Conversion from Islam is illegal, and believers from Muslim backgrounds come under intense pressure to return to their original faith.

Let us pray: Lord Jesus, may the light of Your love pierce through the darkness in Brunei. Please protect our church family there - especially those who come from Muslim backgrounds. Help believers in Brunei to be light and salt in their communities, so that others may come to know You and Your salvation. Amen.

## **THE MINISTER'S THOUGHTS FOR THIS COMING WEEK**

Lectionary Readings for Sunday 6th December 2020 Advent 2.

Psalm 85:1-2 & 8-13, Isaiah 40:1-11, 2 Peter 3:8-15a, Mark 1:1-8.

As I write this letter the hope is that churches can again reopen for worship, although what the government will permit in tier 2 has not yet been fully revealed. But regardless we are preparing for Christmas by putting up the decorations including the advent rings and the nativity scenes. Like the prophet Isaiah in our reading we are preparing a way for ourselves and others to meet with our God in the birth of

Jesus. It is good news that brings both justice and forgiveness, that brings change that benefits all people and not just some. This is reflected in verse 2 of John Bell's advent hymn:

"The second for the prophets,  
who said that Christ would come  
with good news for many  
and angry words for some."

At the beginning of Mark's gospel we have very different preparations from most of our traditional Christmas preparations. John the Baptist is preparing the way for people meeting with Jesus, through asking people to acknowledge and turn away from their sin and failings and then seeking to live their lives in accordance with God's will. Something that is repeated in Peter's letter, with his call for his readers to always be ready to meet with Jesus whenever that happens including Jesus' promised second coming at a future unknown time.

Christmas is more than getting together with family and friends as important as that is for us; it is about meeting with the God who chose to enter our world and change it and to be with us, by entering our world as a new born baby in a stable in Bethlehem, who would grow up and go on to give his life for us on a cross outside of Jerusalem.

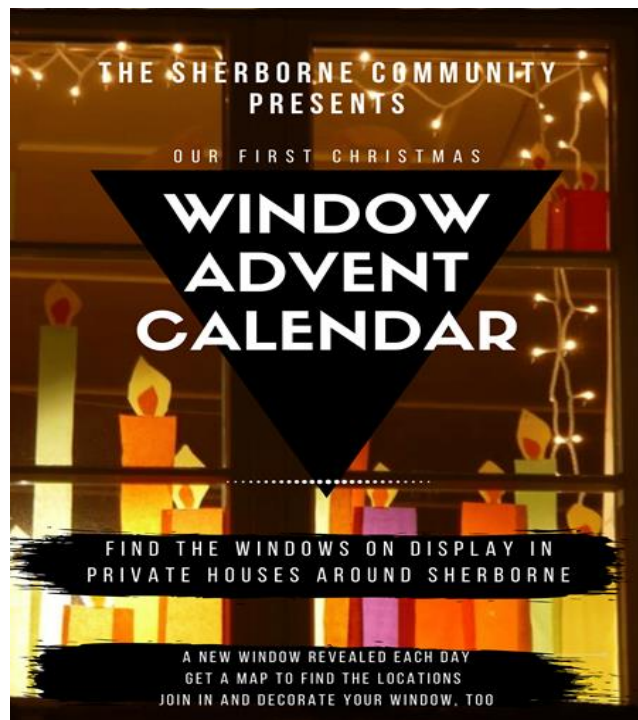
