PRAYERS FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

Prayers for the persecuted church: **Burkina Faso, West Africa.** Extremist attacks have driven followers of Jesus from their homes and villages, with many being forced into refugee camps. This is particularly true in the northeast of the country, where there are now no open churches. Violence has decreased slightly but is far from over. Christians who have converted from Islam also face significant pressure and opposition from their families and communities. Families may reject Christian converts, many of whom choose to keep their new faith secret.

Let us praise God that there have been fewer violent attacks and pray that this trend continues. We pray for Christians to receive grace so they can stand firm in their faith in the face of hostility, and that peace will return to the country so that believers can go back to their villages. Amen.
